

Patient Instruction Sheet for Penile Injections for Erections

Introduction

Penile injections are a treatment for erectile dysfunction (ED) that involves injecting medication directly into the penis. This treatment helps achieve and maintain an erection by enhancing blood flow to the penis. Common medications used include alprostadil, papaverine, and phentolamine.

Components

- **1. Medication:** Pre-filled syringe or vials.
- 2. Syringes and Needles: Typically a small, fine needle (29-30 gauge).
- **3. Alcohol Swabs:** For disinfecting the injection site.
- **4. Sharps Container:** For safe disposal of used needles and syringes.

- Clean the injection site with an alcohol swab.
- Hold the penis along the shaft and stretch it slightly.
- Insert the needle at a 90-degree angle into the chosen site.
- Push the plunger slowly to inject the medication.
- Remove the needle and apply pressure to the injection site with an alcohol swab to minimize bleeding.

- Gently massage the penis to help distribute the medication.

Troubleshooting

• If an Erection Lasts Longer Than 4 Hours:

Seek **immediate medical attention** to avoid permanent damage (a condition known as priapism).

• If You Experience Pain or Discomfort:

Consult your healthcare provider if you experience significant pain, bruising, or swelling.

Most medications work within 5 to 20 minutes.
